Admissions Corner

The spring, summer and fall 2019 application is open, and admission is off to a great start. Here are a few quick reminders and updates to assist you with students who want to be Mountaineers!

<u>Suggested Dates to Apply:</u> Our suggested dates are still in effect. For all terms, we admit students until the classes are full and it's typical to extend past the suggested dates.

- Spring October 15
- Summer and Fall February 15

Decision Timeframe: 2-4 weeks after the application is complete

<u>Fall Transfer Scholarships</u>: Students are now able to access the scholarship application in their MyMountaineer portal after applying for summer or fall of 2019. Deadline to apply is March 15, 2019

Events on Campus: We have a variety of ways for students to connect with Appalachian State: Open House, Transfer Track & Community College group tours.

Distance Education: 2019 applications for Distance Education programs are now open.

Distance Education at Appalachian offers students the opportunity to get a high-quality education that moves with their lifestyle, wherever and whenever. The on-line and off-campus undergraduate programs include business, communication, health care and education. All programs can be located at <u>distance.appstate.edu.</u>

New for 2018-2019

- The Undergraduate Elementary Education program is offering an accelerated part-time option that students can finish in three years. Students will take two evening courses and one course every other Saturday per semester at either the Appalachian Center at Hickory or the Appalachian Center at Burke. Professors will blend face-to-face and video conferencing instruction methods.
- The new Workforce Education and Development undergraduate program is transfer friendly and offers classes in areas such as corporate training, business management, information technology, finance, organizational development, consultation and total quality management.
- On the graduate side, a new certificate in Appalachian Studies is ideal for those wanting a greater understanding of the questions that shape the Appalachian region. Dive deep into Appalachian folklore, music and sustainability with the largest repository of Appalachian books and journals in the world.
