Application Review Facts

Close to 2,000 new Seahawks started classes as transfer students during Summer/Fall 2017. Our review process for transfer students encompasses a holistic approach, considering all pieces of information a student provides us (overall GPA, courses taken, academic trends, essay, etc). The most competitive transfer students have at least 24 hours (completed or in progress college coursework) including: two semesters of college level English and one semester of college level math with an overall GPA of at least a 2.5.
